Modified Quarantine: after exposure where both parties are wearing masks at school Fully vaccinated individuals need not quarantine after exposure.

Unvaccinated staff who have close contact to a positive case **must quarantine** and may return to work when 10 days have passed since the last known close contact (regardless of if both parties were wearing masks or not).

When a **student** is exposed **at school** (more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period within 0-6 feet) where **both parties were wearing a mask** in any school setting in which students are supervised by school staff (including indoor or outdoor school settings and school buses, including buses operated by public and private school systems), unvaccinated students **may** undergo a **modified 10-day quarantine** and continue to attend school if they:

- are asymptomatic;
- · continue to appropriately mask, as required;
- undergo at least twice weekly testing during the 10-day quarantine; and
- continue to quarantine for all extracurricular activities at school, including sports, and activities within the community setting.

Modified Quarantine may end after Day 7 if a test is collected after Day 5 from the date of last exposure, and tests negative.

Asymptomatic close contacts must continue to self-monitor for symptoms through day 14 from last known exposure. If any symptoms develop during this 14 day period, they must immediately isolate, get tested and contact their healthcare provider.

Fully vaccinated individuals need **not** quarantine after exposure unless the exposure involves a household member.

Unvaccinated staff who have close contact to a positive case **must quarantine** and may return to work when 10 days have passed since the last known close contact (regardless of if both parties were wearing masks or not).

When a **student** is exposed **at school** (more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period within 0-6 feet) where **both parties were wearing a mask** in any school setting in which students are supervised by school staff (including indoor or outdoor school settings and school buses, including buses operated by public and private school systems), unvaccinated students **may** undergo a **modified 10-day quarantine** and continue to attend school if they:

- · are asymptomatic;
- continue to appropriately mask, as required;
- undergo at least twice weekly testing during the 10-day quarantine; and
- continue to quarantine for all extracurricular activities at school, including sports, and activities within the community setting.

Modified Quarantine may end after Day 7 if a test is collected after Day 5 from the date of last exposure, and tests negative.

Asymptomatic close contacts must continue to self-monitor for symptoms through day 14 from last known exposure.

If any symptoms develop during this 14 day period, they must immediately isolate, get tested and contact their healthcare provider.



Quarantine at Home: after exposure when one or both parties are without a mask or exposure is not in school Fully vaccinated individuals need not quarantine after exposure.

Unvaccinated students **must** quarantine at home if they are exposed to a COVID-19 positive case outside of school or when one or both parties were <u>not wearing a mask</u>. Quarantine can end after Day 10 from the date of last exposure without testing; OR Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a diagnostic specimen is collected on or after Day 5 from the date of last exposure and tests negative.

Note: Unvaccinated individuals exposed to a positive case in the home are considered continuously exposed and begin their quarantine after their positive household member completes their isolation period.

Asymptomatic close contacts must continue to self-monitor for symptoms through day 14 from last known exposure. If any symptoms develop during this 14 day period, they must immediately isolate, get tested and contact their healthcare provider.

Fully vaccinated individuals need not quarantine after exposure.

Unvaccinated students **must** quarantine at home if they are exposed to a COVID-19 positive case outside of school or when one or both parties were <u>not wearing a mask</u>. Quarantine can end after Day 10 from the date of last exposure without testing; OR Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a diagnostic specimen is collected on or after Day 5 from the date of last exposure and tests negative.

Note: Unvaccinated individuals exposed to a positive case in the home are considered continuously exposed and begin their quarantine after their positive household member completes their isolation period.

Asymptomatic close contacts must continue to self-monitor for symptoms through day 14 from last known exposure.

If any symptoms develop during this 14 day period, they must immediately isolate, get tested and contact their healthcare provider.



Cleaning & Disinfecting

Staff **should** clean frequently-touched surfaces at school and on school buses daily using EPA approved cleaning agents (list "N"). Buses **should** be thoroughly cleaned daily and after transporting any individual who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19. If a facility has had a sick person with COVID-19 within the last 24 hours, clean AND disinfect the spaces occupied by that person during that time.

- Trained custodians should clean and disinfect frequentlytouched surfaces once a day.
- Teachers and other staff should wipe frequently touched surfaces using neutral cleaning agents as often as necessary.
- All staff and students will wash hands multiple times a day.



Distancing

There are no distancing requirements for the classroom. On school buses, it is **recommended** to maximize space between students and between students and the driver, and open windows to the greatest extent practicable. Two windows on a bus should be opened fully at a minimum.
